In 1980, during Operation Eagle Claw, a courageous but failed attempt was made to rescue 52 Americans held hostage in Iran. Eight Special Operations Forces lost their lives on that tragic

day, leaving behind 17 children.

Their teammates made an immediate, enduring battlefield promise to take care of those, and subsequent, surviving children in what became fully funding college educations and additional educational opportunities, "cradle to career" (preschool - college), for the surviving children of Special Operations Forces lost in the line of duty, as well as children of all Medal of Honor Recipients. The feeling then was, and will continue to be, it is the least we can do to honor those who made, and unfortunately will make, the ultimate sacrifice. SOWF also provides immediate financial assistance to severely wounded, ill, and injured Special Operations Personnel.

In 2022, SOWF expanded eligibility to include active-duty Special Operations Personnel who have lost a spouse - this recognizes the critical role spouses play in the lives of our families. These children will now receive the same benefits as all other children in SOWF's educational programs.
